PSIA-AASI Intermountain Region - CS1 Exemption Process Updated September 2024

The National Children's Task Force (NCTF) has established and approved guidelines for those professionals that wish to seek an exemption from taking the Children's Specialist 1 (CS1) course prior to taking the Children's Specialist 2 (CS2) course.

Exemption Process Requirements:

- Petitioner must be a member of PSIA/AASI and PSIA/AASI-Intermountain
- Petitioner shall submit a CS1 "Exemption Request" application to the Children's Program Manager (Meaghan Lovely – <u>mclovely.csimd@gmail.com</u>)
- The application letter and resume should outline the petitioner's background, qualifications and experience meriting the CS1 exemption, including but not limited to
 - Minimum PSIA-AASI Level 2 certification
 - Exceptional experience in children's teaching, coaching, mentoring, or education (e.g., undergraduate and/or post-graduate training) applicable to teaching Children's Snowsports
 - o Minimum 3-to-5 years Snowsports teaching experience
- Petitioner must successfully complete the CS1 e-Learning course with verification submitted with the application at least thirty (30) days prior to signing up for a CS2 event.
- If a petitioner fails to successfully complete the CS1 e-Learning course, the petitioner must complete the entire CS1 course before being allowed to attend a CS2 event.
- Upon committee evaluation of the application, the petitioner will be notified if their exemption request is approved.
- After receiving this notification, the petitioner must attend and participate in a PSIA/AASI-I CS1 Prep Webinar prior to signing up for a CS2 event.
- Completion of CS2 Quiz will be required for the Intermountain Region office to manually enroll Petitioner for the CS2 Event.
- If a petitioner fails any part of the CS2 course, he/she must restart the CS curriculum pathway by completing the entire CS1 course before attending another CS2
